In a physical sense, everything is replotted, rethought; socially, the move can engender an unexpected renewal. A new neighborhood means new routines and, correspondingly, new opportunities.

For those considering a move to a more urban space, the 52 condominiums—eight or nine to a floor—in Opus Northwest LLC's six-story Nine North building represent a well-stacked deck indeed. Those heretofore happily housed in the county may find the development's three-bedroom, two-bath units (1,624 square feet) surprisingly ample. For med students and graduates seeking a simple place to crash, on the other hand, one-bedroom units ranging from 904 to 1,028 square feet can provide quiet refuge.

Each unit comes with floor-to-ceiling tinted, low-e windows and a wide balcony, offering bustling views to some, calm terrace views (including the blue glow of the shared swimming pool and hot tub, come nightfall) to others. A sleek kitchen and entertaining space comprises wood cabin-

etry, bamboo flooring, granite countertops, and brushed-steel Bosch appliances; a washer and dryer can be tucked neatly away in a nearby hall closet. A fitness room is available, although given your location, you may find yourself exercising more often via extended neighborhood exploration or on Forest Park's many paths.

The monthly condo association fee here runs 30 cents per square foot—between \$271 and \$487 a month—and covers homeowner's insurance and almost all utilities, including heating and cooling. (On that front, a heat-pump HVAC system and concrete construction combine to efficiently keep the elements at bay.) A fob and keycard system provides access to private, secure parking; each unit also comes with separate storage space.

From here, the Central West End library's a mere couple of blocks north, Maryland Plaza and the Chase just a few blocks beyond that. The closest MetroLink stop lies three blocks south. Culture, dining, and shopping are all within reach—just pick a card, any card, and prepare to be dazzled.
